Guidelines for Pre Ph.D. presentations

- 1. The number of slides in the presentation should be 35 to 40.
- 2. The duration of entire presentation should not exceed 25 minutes.
- 3. The number of lines in each slide should be up to 10.
- 4. The first slide should have the proposed title. The second slide should have student's publications list along with their indexing in SCIE/ Scopus/ MCQ etc.
- 5. The next slide/s should contain the tentative table of contents of the thesis.
- 6. During the first 5 to 10 minutes of the presentation it is expected that the student should give the brief summary and/ or motivation of the work done in a manner that is understandable by students/ faculties of all the areas. The next 15 to 20 minutes the student may focus on the major technical results chapter wise.
- 7. In the references only those papers should be listed that are cited by the student in the presentation itself.
- 8. Mere reading of statements of the theorems from the slide may be avoided as far as possible. The students should tell the crux of the results in own words.
- 9. The student should give proper reference while presenting someone else result.
